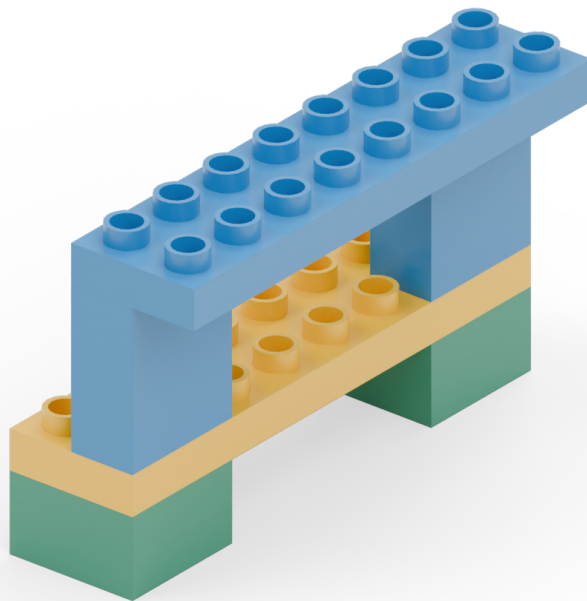


BUILD TOGETHER

Garden bench

6 pieces / 4 steps

Six pieces make a little garden bench with a bright seat and high back. Start with the two feet, then join them to make a place for a pretend rest.



A little model, a little story

Decide where the bench belongs.

Imagine two visitors meeting here.

Describe the sounds they can hear in the garden.

Digital guide; no bricks included. Make it together with an adult.

GETTING STARTED

Before you build

Match the shapes

Compare each part with its picture and count its rows of studs. A square brick has two rows of two studs; a long brick has two rows of four. Use the full parts list for the exact shapes and quantities.

Follow the colours

Match the shapes and quantities. The pictures show our colours. Colour names in the steps refer to the pictures. Keep contrasting colours where they help you recognise the model.

Count the studs

The bumps on top are called studs. Count them when a step asks for a gap or an overhang. Put the build on a flat surface and keep its front facing the same way as in the pictures.

Add a little at a time

New pieces keep their colour in each step. Earlier pieces look lighter so you can see what has changed. Each list tells you exactly what to add.

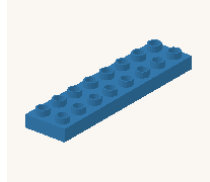
Build together

An adult can read the steps while a child finds the pieces. The counts are for this one model. For two models to stay built, add their parts lists together.

GATHER YOUR PIECES

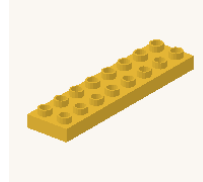
Exact parts checklist

Match the shapes and quantities. The pictures show our colours. Choose your own colours for the same parts; changing a part's shape is a different substitution.

**1 x Long plate (2 × 8 studs)**

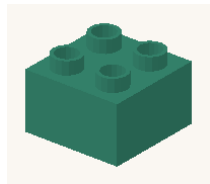

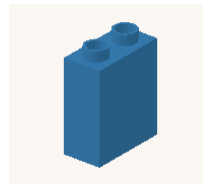

Shape-only checklist

Use this list to sort the shapes. Check the full colour list before building; the two lists count the same pieces.

[] 2 x Long plate (2 × 8 studs)

[] 2 x Square brick (2 × 2 studs)

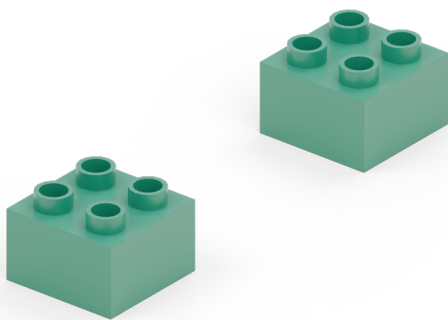
[] 2 x Wall brick (1 × 2 studs, double height)

Total: 6 pieces

BUILD, ONE STEP AT A TIME

Step 1 - 2

01 / Set two green square bricks in a line with four stud rows of space between them.

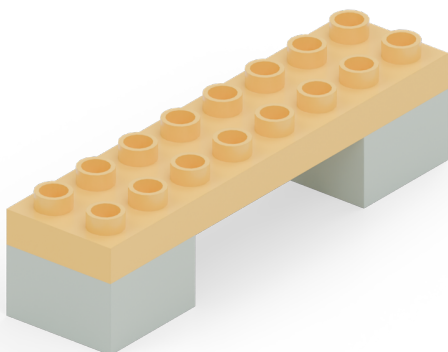


ADD THESE PIECES

2 x Square brick (2 × 2 studs) (Green)

New pieces keep their colour. Earlier pieces are lighter.

02 / Join the legs with the yellow long plate. Its ends line up with the outer edges of the legs.



ADD THESE PIECES

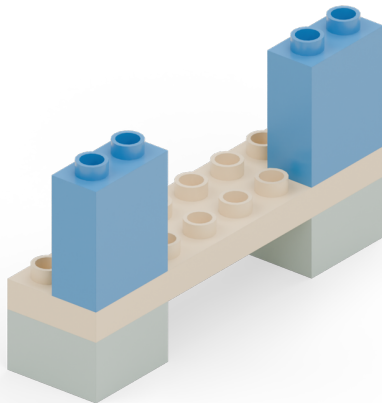
1 x Long plate (2 × 8 studs) (Yellow)

New pieces keep their colour. Earlier pieces are lighter.

BUILD, ONE STEP AT A TIME

Step 3 - 4

03 / At each end of the seat, add a blue wall brick along the back row of studs.

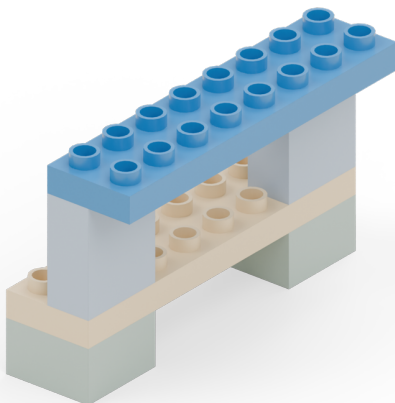


ADD THESE PIECES

2 x Wall brick (1 × 2 studs, double height)
(Blue)

New pieces keep their colour. Earlier pieces are lighter.

04 / Bridge the two blue wall bricks with the blue long plate. The front half of the seat stays open.



ADD THESE PIECES

1 x Long plate (2 × 8 studs) (Blue)

New pieces keep their colour. Earlier pieces are lighter.

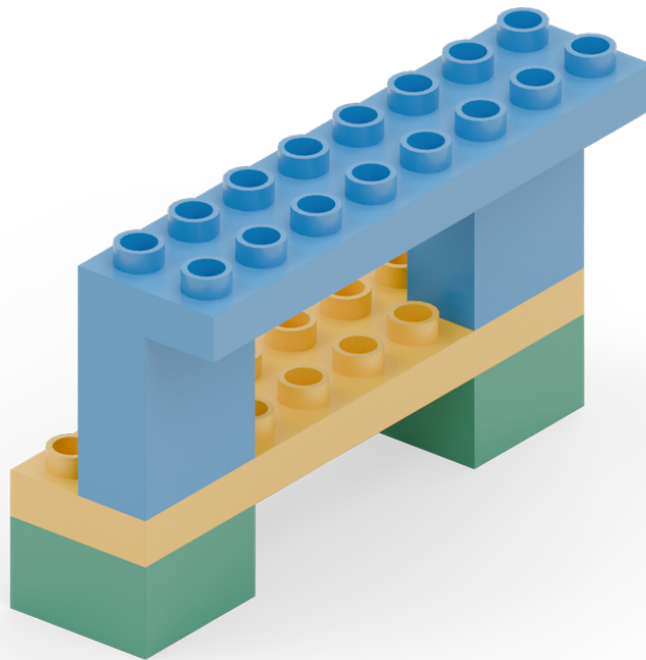
READY TO PLAY
